The Children's Championship is open to athletes from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14.

The Juniors' Championship is open to athletes from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

The Young Riders' Championship is open to athletes from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

VIII. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Declarations

Chef d'équipe must declare the composition of their 4 horses/ athlete in writing on Wednesday, July 14th, 2010 before 18 h 00 at the General Secretary for the Children and on Thursday, July 15th, 2010 before 18 h 00 for the Juniors and Young Riders.

Horses starting in the Farewell competitions Saturday, July 17th, 2010 must be declared the night before at the General Secretary, at the latest 30 minutes after the prize giving ceremony of Team competition.

2. Practice Arenas

Training (including working, lunging and walking) of horses is only allowed at specified times on the official and controlled exercise areas, provided by the

Organising Committee from Tuesday, July 13th, 2010 (immediately after Horse Inspection) until the conclusion of the event on Sunday, July 18th, 2010
The exercise / practice areas will be permanently controlled by FEI stewards.

During a competition, the practice area (sand) is strictly reserved to athletes and their horses, starting in the present competition.

The next three athletes must be mounted and ready to enter the arena. If a athlete is not ready when his/her starting number/name is called, he/she will lose his/her place in the starting order and he/she will be eliminated from that competition at the discretion of the Ground Jury, unless certain circumstances prevent this (e.g. losing a horse shoe just before his/her turn to start).

3. Image Rights

The Organising Committee reserves the right to use-without any compensation due – photographs, slides, video tapes or any other (digital) registered picture from athlete and/or horses, made or registered during the EU-CH-YR/J Jardy 2010, for promotional and/or marketing purposes related to the event.

It is a condition of entry that all athlete will permit any photographic or filmed material derived during the course of the event, to be utilised subsequently by the Organising Committee for future promotion of their business interests or the show at no cost to the latter.

4. INCIVILITY

Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any judge, steward, veterinary or any show officials on the part of the Chef d'Equipe, athlete, groom, driver or agent of a horse may – at the discretion of the President of the Ground Jury – disqualify that horse from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

5. PARADING

All horses must be paraded whenever so ordered by the Organising Committee or by a duly authorised show official. Any failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification from competing and forfeiture of prizes, at the discretion of the President of the Ground Jury.

6. DOGS

No dogs allowed on the showground.
Elsewhere, Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times; offences against this rule may lead to permanent withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

7. VIP HOSPITALITY

CHECKLIST FOR DRAFT SCHEDULE JUMPING 2009/2010

The Organising Committee provides the option to book a VIP-table in a VIP-stand at a price of 2.500 € per table for the entire 5-days of the Championships; the table provides a place for 6 persons per day. The price of a VIP-table includes access to the daily buffet with not included drinks)

The Organising Committee also provides elevated private space of 25 m² (roofed) + balcony(15 m²) around the arena, to follow the competition, at the price of 3.500 €. Possibility to have paying meals and drinks, not included in this place.
