#### Number of foreign athletes per NF:

**Teams:** Each European National Federation, affiliated to the FEI, may participate with one team per age group. Every team is composed of three athletes and three horses or four athletes and four horses. For each age group five horses may be entered but only four horses may be brought to the event. In a team composed of four athletes, the three best scores only count for the team result.

#### Individuals instead of team:

Nations, which cannot send a team may enter up to two individual athletes with one horse each per age group.

The respective NF decides which athletes to send.

Chef d'Equipe, trainer and veterinarian of a team are invited by the Organising Committee, they receive the same privileges as the athletes.

#### **Athletes**

Juniors, age group 1992 – 1996 Young Riders, age group 1989 - 1994

#### **Horses**

CH-EU-D-J: 6 years and older CH-EU-D-Y: 7 years and older

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting Athletes ("masterlist"), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

#### VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

#### A) ATHLETES

Hotel reservation for Athletes may only be done on written order by closing date of nominated entries (by 22/06/2010). Later reservation or reservation made by phone cannot be taken into consideration! Expenses will be at the Athletes' own cost, this also applies to no-show, drinks, meals, telephone etc. Athletes will receive from 19/07/2010 – 25/07/2010 one meal (lunch) per day; further meals will be at the Athletes' own expense.

The OC will invoice the rooms to the account of the Athlete, unless the rooms have been cancelled by 25/06/2010.

#### B) GROOMS

One groom per athlete.

Reguests for accommodation has to be sent with entries (by 22/06/2010).

Accommodation from 19/07/2010 - 25/07/2010 will be at the Athletes' expense.

Meals will be available on the show grounds, however the costs have to be taken over by the Athletes.

The OC provides sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.



#### C) HORSES

Horses will be stabled free of charge (1<sup>st</sup> bedding included - 3 bales of straw) from 19/07/2010 - 26/07/2010 in stable tents on the show grounds. However, for waste disposal a fee of 40,00 € will be levied. Stables have to be ordered together with the entries. Per nation and age group two tack boxes will be made available free of charge. For further tack boxes a fee of 80.00 € will be levied.

For additional horses a fee of  $140 \in \text{per horse}$  (incl. VAT) plus  $40,00 \in \text{for}$  waste disposal will be charged. If boxes will be cancelled after closing date of definite entries, the fee will be invoiced to the Athlete or respective NF.

Unless boxes have been reserved by 22/06/2010, per horse entered one box will be reserved and invoiced. Athletes are asked to use only the assigned stables. For current supply a fee of 50,00 € will be charged.

The OC grants no reimbursement of transport charges.

#### D) WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival.

### E) LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

There will be a shuttle service (approx. every 90 min.) between hotel and show grounds. The exact times will be published on site.

#### F) ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES

The Athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 135. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 135 of the General Regulations.

All Athletes & horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI.

Customs and veterinary fees for entering and leaving the frontier for the CH-EU-D YJ will be taken over by the OC.

#### 2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification o the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid from will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

### <u>VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS</u>

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23<sup>rd</sup> Edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009, update 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010:

#### Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

#### Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

#### EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

- 1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).
- 2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).



- 3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FFI event.
- 4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

#### SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3\* and CCI4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

#### MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

#### X. MISCELLANEOUS

#### 1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

### 2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS and PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION

The winner, the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> placed Athlete will receive a prize of honour; all placed horses will receive a ribbon. FEI-medals for team, individual and freestyle (Juniors and Young Riders) for place one to three will be awarded in the evening of the day of decision.

#### 3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

All placed Athletes must take part in the prize giving ceremony. The prize giving ceremony will take place on the showground at the end of each competition.



#### 4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the VAT from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

#### 5. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

#### 6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

#### 7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER, the Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Dressage Department by the Foreign Judge.

#### 8. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CHEFS D'EQUIPE

The Chefs d'Equipe are responsible for the behaviour of their team members throughout the championships. They and their NF are furthermore responsible for all damages caused by their team members. Chefs d'Equipe have to stay with their athletes.



#### 9. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Athletes, grooms and horse owners will receive free entrance (max. 5 per Athlete: Athlete, per Athlete one partner, one groom per Athlete and per horse two horse owners acc. to FEI passport). In addition per nation one Chef d'Equipe receives free entrance.

Entry right to the stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

#### 10. OPEN SCORING

There will be open scoring, except for the Freestyle. The boards will be affixed in a way that they cannot be seen by the judges.

#### THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

#### **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

The value of the 1<sup>st</sup> prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money distributed for the competition. The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed. If fewer athletes take part in a competition than the number of prizes indicated in the schedule, the President of the Ground Jury is responsible for recalculating the prize money to be distributed. Distribution of prize money (min. 5 if less than 20 athletes in the competition) distributed to 25 % of athletes (GR Art 127, 128).
