## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

## FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

1. The World Breeding Championship for Young Horses in Dressage will be organised under FEI Rules with the support of the World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses. The selection procedure will be decided by the relevant National Federations in close cooperation with the WBFSH breeding organisation(s) in that respective country. The horses must have shown results of at least $68 \%$ in a selection procedure in appropriate Young Horse Classes at national level. The result has to be confirmed with the entry by the nominating NF. Horses are only allowed to take part in a selection procedure of one country and not more.
2. a) The general principle is that only NFs may nominate horses if there is a WBFSH member studbook within the country of that respective NF.
b) An exception to the rule 2.a) can be made for NFs, if

- the athlete is an athlete with the nationality of that respective NF and
- the horse is a horse of a WBFSH member studbook and owned by a person whose nationality is of the respective NFs country and
- the (origin)studbook of the horse and the NF of that respective country, where the horse/athlete-combination is training, support the nomination.

3. a) The general principle is that NFs will enter horses that have a pedigree of a national studbook, which is a member of the WBFSH and whose seat is within the field of activity inside the respective NF.
b) An exception to the rule that horses have a pedigree of a studbook which is a member of the WBSFH and whose seat is within the field of activity inside the respective NF, can be made in 2014. NFs can apply for an exception in 2014 , but only in close cooperation with the national WBFSH breeding organisation(s) within that respective country.
4. The number of horses which may be entered by NFs in each class (i.e. five and six year old) is as follows:

- Germany 7
-The Netherlands 6
- Denmark 4
- Sweden 4

All other accredited NFs may enter up to two horses in each class, if there is a WBFSH member studbook within the country of that respective NF. All other accredited NFs may enter one horse in each class.
The age of Horses is counted from $1^{\text {st }}$ January of the year of birth ( $1^{\text {st }}$ August for Southern Hemisphere), i.e. in 2014 the following horses may participate:
5 year old horses, born in the Northern Hemisphere:
must have been born between $1^{\text {st }}$ January 2009 and 31 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ December 2009
6 year old horse, , born in the Northern Hemisphere:
must have been born between $1^{\text {st }}$ January 2008 and $31^{\text {st }}$ December 2008
5 year old horses, born in the Southern Hemisphere:
must have been born between $1^{\text {st }}$ August 2008 and 31 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ July 2009
6 year old horse, , born in the Southern Hemisphere:
must have been born between $1^{\text {st }}$ August 2007 and $31^{\text {st }}$ July 2008
6. As an exception to the FEI General Regulations, NFs may enter athletes of a different nationality provided the athlete's NF will give its approval. The combination of this exception with exception number 3 b ) is not allowed.
6. Wildcards:

- NFs may apply for wildcards only for horses that are registered in member studbooks of the territory of the respective NF and are trained abroad, but only in close cooperation with the national WBFSH breeding organisation(s) within that respective country. These horses must have shown results of at least $75 \%$ in a selection procedure in accordance with 1.
- Exceptions to this rule will be considered for 2014 only for horses with a pedigree (showing at least three full generations) of a studbook, which has not been a member of the WBFSH and whose field of activity does not extend over a country in which already a WBFSH member exists. The exception will be made only once.
- The number of wildcards depends on the total number of horses entered - a max. number of 50 horses per age group will be admitted.
- Wildcards will be decided by the WBFSH and the FEI in close cooperation with the OC's NF and the OC.
- Wildcards will be assigned in the following proportions: GER max 3, NED max 2, and all other NFs max 1.
- Only wildcard requests from NFs will be considered; requests received from individuals will directly be refused.
- Wildcards will apply to specific horses only and will not be subject to substitution by NFs.
- Only the OC in close cooperation with the OC's NF and the FEI may allow substitutions.
- Wildcards cannot be assigned to horses that have taken part in national selection systems, unless the respective NF agrees.
-The final decision regarding wildcards and substitutions will be decided by the WBFSH and the FEI. No further appeal against this decision will be allowed.

At the World Championship for 5 year old Young Horses a special prize will be awarded to the athlete of the horse with the highest mark for the submissiveness in the Preliminary Test for 5 year old horses(competition 1). In case of equal marks for the submissiveness the mark for the walk is added in addition. If there is still equality of total marks then the score for the canter will be added. If there are still horses with the same total marks there will be a draw for the special prize.

## 3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The OC reserves the right, to hold single prize-giving ceremonies of medal winners of $\mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{M}-\mathrm{D}$ YH (in addition to the normal prize-giving ceremonies) in other competitions arenas of the show grounds. The Athletes are obliged to attend them.

## 4. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.
The FEI insures all FEI Officials, whose names are published in the FEI Officials lists, against third party liability including Judges, Course Designers, Technical Delegates, FEI Stewards, FEI Veterinary Delegates, Para Classifiers, Members of the Judges' Supervisory Panel and FEI Coaches (FEI MCP Veterinarians are covered under a different policy):

- Who are acting for or on behalf of the FEI as stated in the approved schedule of the Event or who are acting in the scope and course of the FEI's Business as described in the final approved schedule; and
- Who have received the status of FEI Officials at FEI Events through a qualification process.
The FEI will NOT insure:
- National officials officiating at FEI Events; and/or
- FEI Officials, who have no official function at the Event.

The insurance extended is for any liability that the FEI Official incurs to a third party, and for the costs of defending any such claim arising as a result of actions undertaken by the FEI Official in good faith (including errors and omissions) on behalf of the FEI. However, the insurance for obvious reasons does not extend to any liabilities incurred as a result of an FEI Official's dishonest, fraudulent, malicious, and/or illegal act.

Should an FEI Official become aware of an incident that he or she believes might result in a claim, that FEI Official should notify the FEI immediately and provide all of the facts known to the FEI Official. The FEI cannot guarantee the insurance coverage described above in circumstances where the FEI Official has good cause to believe that there might be a claim and does not provide such timely notice directly to the FEI.

## LIABILITY

## 2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

## GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

## ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is obliged to deliver all necessary health certificates for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:
a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 (see annex Vet. I) of the actual valid form will be necessary.
b) in case of arrival from a country not belonging to the EU, a health certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II (see Annex Vet. II) of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.
A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.
The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.
In case the OC has entrusted a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.
Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

## 4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, and the Horse be in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have a responsibility to be in compliance of national legislation in both the country of origin, return, and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No $1 / 2005$ concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

## 5. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION \& FITNESS TO COMPETE

## PASSPORTS

General Regulations Article 137

## For all Horses FEI Passports/FEI Recognition Cards issues, please address to your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.
FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards - for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI, are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outlined below.

Athletes whose Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other passport requirements including for vaccination and Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030) will be subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations and may not be allowed to compete.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

## VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA

2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028
Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).

## EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL

## 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

## HORSE INSPECTIONS

## 2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in
the competition.

## LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive (both of which shall constitute "abnormal limb sensitivity"). Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.

All Horses are subject to Examination under the Protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the Period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for Examination under the Protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

## 6. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION 2014 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

Within FEI Groups I \& II, the Organising Committee should charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is affected by the FEI Veterinary Department.

## SAMPLING

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2014 Veterinary Regulations Article 1057 and 1058).

## CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: www.FEICleanSport.org (the EPSL) as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances (please refer to www.FEI.org/veterinary for information and details Art. 1956).

## 7. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection and throughout the event be subject to the requirements of the 2014 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV.
8. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; such information is essential to ensure that (i) the Horse's welfare remains paramount at all times and (ii) sound scientific reasoning is applied to the safety of all Horses and Athletes participating at Events.

## XI. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to the ADRHAs, Organisers must provide the following at Events where human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at least 2 months prior to the Event:

1. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the Doping Control Officers (DCOs) with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the FEI at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the Event.
2. Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:

- one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the DCOs with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and
- a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks ; and
- one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the DCO room and waiting area.

3. Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as Chaperones. The number of Chaperones available to the OC must be communicated to the FEI as early as possible following receipt by the OC of the Testing plan for the Event. Please see the qualifications for Chaperones in the ADRHAs.

## DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS PRIZE MONEY Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.
Settlement will be done per athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the VAT from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 \% exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present $5.5 \%$ ) of the income amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the

reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.
If Athletes have to be placed equally, the money value of possible prizes in kind (e. g. a car) is divided accordingly.
